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
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
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HALF THE MAN I USED TO BE?

Guuuuurrrrrl, if you're looking for wicked dialogue, a jaundiced glance at late-1960's gay life in Manhattan and a wince-worthy "Connie Casserole" stereotype or two, don't miss Harold's birthday party...



...and by that we mean the 1970 LGBT classic, The Boys In The Band, directed by William Friedkin, screening Wednesday night, June 8th, at Tropic Cinema, beginning at 6 p.m.



It's just one of the films scheduled during the 2011 Key West Pride Film Festival, expanded to three nights, sponsored by the Education department of AIDS Help and presented free to the public.



Making The Boys, which revisits the stage and film versions of The Boys In The Band, will receive its Key West premiere during the very next night, Thursday, June 9, also at Tropic Cinema, 416 Eaton Street, at 6 p.m.

"We're tremendously excited to reacquaint older theatergoers with TBITB, the first major motion picture to revolve entirely around gay characters, and introduce a younger audience to the laugh-out-loud comebacks and some painful truths of that era," commented Derrick Traylor, Director of Education for AIDS Help. "For years, the movie's been treated as a semi-embarrassment, yet its stamp on film history and our community is undeniable. It shows how far we've come...and how far we have to go."

The new 90-minute Making The Boys explores precisely that: the Off-Broadway roots of Mart Crowley's play, some of the LGBT community's anger over what they perceived as a setback to public acceptance, then Hollywood's resistance when it was translated to the screen with its original cast.

"It also gives great perspective with great interviews with people like Terrence McNally, Edward Albee and, Robert Wagner, and archival footage of Stonewall and the ACT UP era. An epilogue showing how AIDS personally impacted that cast is quite emotional," Traylor said.

The evening's audience should stick around: a live Q/A videoconference discussion with Making the Boys filmmaker Crayton Robey will convene right after.

And The Band Played On will be screened on the final night of the Festival, Friday, June 10th, at Tropic Cinema, 6 p.m.

Based on Randy Shilts' non-fiction study of the international onset of the AIDS pandemic, the 1993 film stars Richard Gere, Alan Alda and Matthew Modine and a roster of other Hollywood biggies.

The production is unflinching. It disappeared since its pay-cable run, and it deserves to be seen again" Traylor explained. "Our decision to include it seemed to complete a trilogy of sorts... linked not only by the word Band, but by the dawning of an era that altered the definition of sex and sexuality forever."

Now in its 4th year, the Key West Pride Film Festival at Tropic Cinema, 416 Eaton Street, has been sponsored and programmed by the Education department at AIDS Help since its inception. The goal: to provide free public access to cinematic works, some little-seen, that promote healthy living. Previous Festival films have included Two Spirits, Key West: City of Colors, The Gift, The Ride: Seven Days To End AIDS and Gay Sex In The 70's.
