YOU MATTER AND SO DOES YOUR HEALTH

That's why starting and staying on HIV-1 treatment is so important.

What is DESCOVY®?

DESCOVY is a prescription medicine that is used together with other HIV-1 medicines to treat HIV-1 in people 12 years and older. DESCOVY is not for use to help reduce the risk of getting HIV-1 infection. DESCOVY combines 2 medicines into 1 pill taken once a day. Because DESCOVY by itself is not a complete treatment for HIV-1, it must be used together with other HIV-1 medicines.

DESCOVY does not cure HIV-1 infection or AIDS.

To control HIV-1 infection and decrease HIV-related illnesses, you must keep taking DESCOVY. Ask your healthcare provider if you have questions about how to reduce the risk of passing HIV-1 to others. Always practice safer sex and use condoms to lower the chance of sexual contact with body fluids. Never reuse or share needles or other items that have body fluids on them.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

What is the most important information I should know about DESCOVY?

DESCOVY may cause serious side effects:

- Buildup of an acid in your blood (lactic acidosis), which is a serious medical emergency. Symptoms of lactic acidosis include feeling very weak or tired, unusual muscle pain, trouble breathing, stomach pain with nausea or vomiting, feeling cold (especially in your arms and legs), teeling dizzy or lightheaded, and/ or a fast or irregular heartbeat.
- Serious liver problems. The liver may become large and fatty. Symptoms of liver problems include your skin or the white part of your eyes turning yellow (jaundice); dark "tea-colored" urine; light-colored bowel movements (stools); loss of appetite; nausea; and/or pain, aching, or tenderness on the right side of your stomach area.

- You may be more likely to get lactic acidosis or serious liver problems if you are female, very overweight, or have been taking DESCOVY for a long time. In some cases, lactic acidosis and serious liver problems have led to death. Call your healthcare provider right away if you have any symptoms of these conditions.
- Worsening of hepatitis B (HBV) infection. DESCOVY is not approved to treat HBV. If you have both HIV-1 and HBV and stop taking DESCOVY, your HBV may suddenly get worse. Do not stop taking DESCOVY without first talking to your healthcare provider, as they will need to monitor your health.

What are the other possible side effects of DESCOVY?

Serious side effects of DESCOVY may also include:

- Changes in body fat, which can happen in people taking HIV-1 medicines.
- Changes in your immune system.
 Your immune system may get stronger and begin to fight infections. Tell your healthcare provider if you have any new symptoms after you start taking DESCOVY.
- Kidney problems, including kidney failure. Your healthcare provider should do blood and urine tests to check your kidneys. Your healthcare provider may tell you to stop taking DESCOVY if you develop new or worse kidney problems.
- Bone problems, such as bone pain, softening, or thinning, which may lead to fractures. Your healthcare provider may do tests to check your bones.

The most common side effect of DESCOVY is nausea. Tell your healthcare provider if you have any side effects that bother you or don't go away.

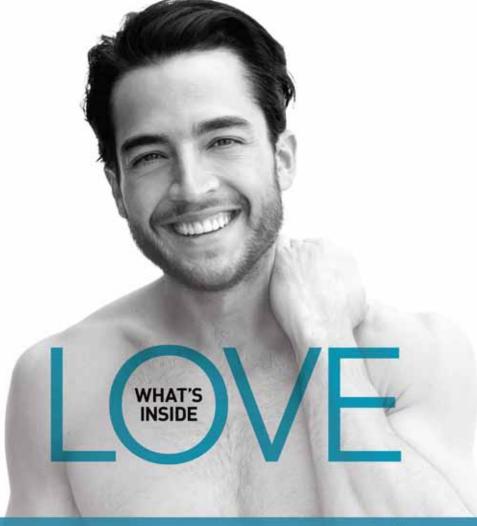
Ask your healthcare provider if an HIV-1 treatment that contains DESCOVY® is right for you.

What should I tell my healthcare provider before taking DESCOVY?

- All your health problems. Be sure to tell your healthcare provider if you have or have had any kidney, bone, or liver problems, including hepatitis virus infection.
- All the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Other medicines may affect how DESCOVY works. Keep a list of all your medicines and show it to your healthcare provider and pharmacist. Ask your healthcare provider if it is safe to take DESCOVY with all of your other medicines.
- If you are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if DESCOVY can harm your unborn baby. Tell your healthcare provider if you become pregnant while taking DESCOVY.
- If you are breastfeeding (nursing) or plan to breastfeed. Do not breastfeed. HIV-1 can be passed to the baby in breast milk.

POSSIBLE SIDE EFFECTS OF DESCOVY

DESCOVY can cause serious side effects, including:

- Those in the "Most Important Information About DESCOVY" section.
- · Changes in body fat.
- Changes in your immune system.
- New or worse kidney problems, including kidney failure.

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

"THE ADA DECADES" BY PAULA MARTINAC

Tick. Tick. Tick.

Your grandmother used to warn you not to wish your life away. The years pass quickly enough, she said, so hold each minute. Savor what you have. Enjoy your days, months, years, and "The Ada Decades" by Paula Martinac.

Ada's daddy needed help around the house.

Once, that was Clay, Jr.'s job but he was busy with high school things, so twelve-year-old Ada fetched Daddy's tools - which was what she was doing when she

found an envelope with naked-lady pictures and a postcard of black men hanging from a tree. She took those pictures from the toolbox, even though she knew she shouldn't, and she approached the only person she could trust: her school's librarian, who explained how things were before the War.

Ten years later, things were still that way. It was 1957 and, as Central Charlotte Junior High's new librarian, Ada watched, paralyzed, while police escorted the school's first black student down the halls. Ada embraced integration, but she hadn't known what to do. She wished she'd had the self-confidence of the English teacher, Cam Lively, who'd welcomed the frightened girl with a smile.

Ada understood fear, that was true. She'd always known she was different, but women weren't supposed to be that way about other women. She didn't know exactly how to say what she felt, but she knew it was wrong — that is, until Miss Lively invited Ada to a "book club" that was really just a gathering for gay men and lesbians.

There, Ada found friends, a tribe, and someone to love.

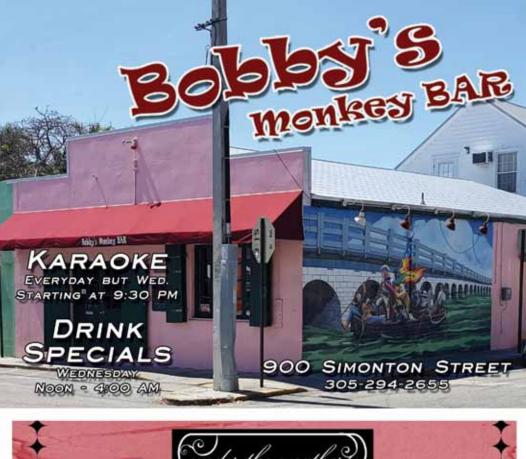
But Ada was from the wrong side of the tracks, her parents were poor, and she felt it. Cam came from money, and neither woman's family approved of the relationship. The pressures they felt in 1962 – the need to hide and keep quiet - were almost unendurable; indeed, some friends couldn't take it anymore. How much easier their lives would be if they could just be themselves!

Readers may notice the word "romantic" on the cover of "The Ada Decades," but that's one of the lesser aspects of this novel. Yes, there's a bit of a love story here, but it's more fictionalized history than anything.

Beginning with a young girl's early understanding of racial discrimination, author Paula Martinac tells a multi-layered tale from the perspective of an often-humorless, rather prudish, and complicated character. Spanning nearly seventy years, the story is appealing, surprisingly chaste, and based within accurately-told historical events - but there's no Forrest Gump here: for Ada and Cam, the outside world is there for commentary, but not always for participation. Instead, Martinac's characters are everyday women, living pleasantly normal lives, and their story ends in a satisfyingly quiet way.

The cover of this book is no grabber and that's too bad because the story itself is, starting on its first page. If you're in the mood for a nice, gentle surprise of a tale that lacks drama and graphic scenes, "The Ada Decades" will tick all the boxes.


mate with. Such is the life of the Lonelys of the world. The life of the party is also, very often, a party of one.

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MAN ABOUT TOWN



Those that know me know that I am not a fine dining connoisseur. I am just as happy with a hot dog as I am with a fine filet mignon. With that in mind, I tend to gravitate towards places that have good food at a good value.

This last month was no exception. For a healthy breakfast, I like to hit Cafe Havana right on Duval Street. With my simple tastes, I love getting egg whites, with a side of bacon, and a fruit cup. Even though this is my "go to" meal, it's never boring because the fruit cup selections change all the time. Being a creature of habit, it's nice to have some variety while still maintaining consistency.

On those rare (ok, maybe not so rare) times that I am not watching what I eat, nothing hit's the spot like a Key Wester breakfast sandwich from Cuban Coffee Queen. Scrambled eggs, bacon, and cheese on a pressed Cuban roll. Add in an iced coffee made with coffee ice cubes so it still tastes like coffee by the time you walk a block down Duval on a hot summer day and all the ice melts.

I am a good New England boy and once in a while, I need a taste of home. You won't find a more authentic Maine Lobster Roll anywhere other than DJ's Clam Shack. Anyone that's ever had a true New England lobster roll will tell you, the only way to serve it is on a buttered and toasted hot dog roll. What's ironic is that I have paid more for a Maine lobster roll in New England than I pay in Key West. Maybe the lobsters found a cheap air fare to get down here.

For dinner I continue looking for the best bargains where I can get a big meal for the best price and for that, you just can't beat El Siboney. This is probably the most authentic Cuban fare on the island and you will not leave hungry. Huge portions, great selection, and enough buttered Cuban bread to feed a family of 4, and I'm in heaven. There is enough food that you'll probably need to take some home. I say probably because I seem to have no problem devouring the meal, the salad, every piece of Cuban bread in the basket (they offer to refill it but I decline knowing I would eat that too) and it takes every bit of strength I have to decline the flan for desert. Quite often, I am too weak to fight it and the flan is gone just as quickly as it's delivered.

At this point, I usually wish I could walk home to burn off some calories, but at the same time, have trouble even making it to the car without laying down and taking a nap on the street.

Whether you need fine dining, or inexpensive fare, Key West has it all. You just need to know where to look.



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


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
