STAY SAFE RIDE SMART



A bicycle is a great way to get around, but stay safe by following the rules of the road.

- A bicycle is like any other vehicle, so you must follow the rules of the road.
 - Bicycles must follow all traffic controls such as signs and signals.
 - Bicycles cannot travel the wrong way down a one way street.
 - Bicycles must be ridden on the right hand side of a two way street.
 - You must signal all turns with hand signals.
 - Headsets cannot be worn while cycling.
 - Riding a bike while under the influence can get you a DUI in Florida.
- Lights are required between sunset and sunrise
 - A white light is required in front and a red light in the rear.
- Riding on the sidewalk or crosswalk is permitted but with these provisions
 - Pedestrians have the right of way. Yield to pedestrians.
- When passing pedestrians, you must signal your intent before doing so.
- Anyone under the age of 16 must wear a helmet.

Here are a few additional tips that you may find helpful.

- Lock up your bike at all times. If not, you'll probably be walking home.
 - Pass the lock through the frame and the front tire.
 - Be careful not to lock your bike to an adjoining bike by accident.
 - If you lock your bike to private property, it may be impounded.
- When approaching occupied cars, be ready to react if the door opens.

Who should not take GENVOYA?

- Certain prescription medicines for other conditions. It is important to ask your healthcare provider or pharmacist about medicines that should not be taken with GENVOYA. Do not start a new medicine without telling your healthcare provider.
- The herbal supplement St. John's wort.
- Any other medicines to treat HIV-1 infection.

What are the other possible side effects of GENVOYA?

Serious side effects of GENVOYA may also include:

- Changes in your immune system. Your immune system may get stronger and begin to fight infections. Tell your healthcare provider if you have any new symptoms after you start taking GENVOYA.
- Kidney problems, including kidney failure.
 Your healthcare provider should do blood
 and urine tests to check your kidneys. If you
 develop new or worse kidney problems, they
 may tell you to stop taking GENVOYA.

- Too much lactic acid in your blood (lactic acidosis), which is a serious but rare medical emergency that can lead to death. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you get these symptoms: weakness or being more tired than usual, unusual muscle pain, being short of breath or fast breathing, stomach pain with nausea and vomiting, cold or blue hands and feet, feel dizzy or lightheaded, or a fast or abnormal heartbeat.

What should I tell my healthcare provider before taking GENVOYA?

WHAT IS GENVOYA?

GENVOYA is a 1-pill, once-a-day prescription medicine used to treat HIV-1 in people 12 years and older who weigh at least 77 pounds. It can either be used in people who are starting HIV-1 treatment and have never taken HIV-1 medicines before. or people who are replacing their current HIV-1 medicines and whose healthcare provider determines they meet certain requirements. These include having an undetectable viral load (less than 50 copies/mL) for 6 months or more on their current HIV-1 treatment. GENVOYA combines 4 medicines into 1 pill taken once a day with food. GENVOYA is a complete HIV-1 treatment and should not be used with other HIV-1 medicines.





"SELF-MADE WOMAN: A MEMOIR" By Denise Chanterelle Dubois

Your own two hands.

That's what it took — plus a bit of paint, pencil or pen, rouge and ribbon and rickrack — to make that of which you are proud. You did that. You made it with your own two hands. As in the new book "Self-Made Woman" by Denise Chanterelle DuBois, it takes a lot to craft a new life.

It began near a lakeside cabin in Wisconsin.

DuBois says she was four then, a curious little boy who loved the water – until he fell in and nearly drowned.

Once fished out, he was dressed in girl's clothing while his dried, and he was enchanted. He fought his mother's demands that he give the clothing up. That was the beginning of DuBois' lifetime journey toward womanhood.

Though his parents were both alcoholics, and abusive, Catholic school nuns were the ones who showed DuBois that sexual stimulation could come from humiliation. In grade school, he preferred playing with girls because he was a girl himself, but teachers and nuns forbade it. When embarrassed in class, he felt stirrings; he asked playmates to spank him, and he learned to welcome negative attention.

This led to petty theft and a secret life: DuBois began sneaking into his sister's closet to wear her clothing. He broke into random buildings to steal panties from strangers, and he lost a babysitting job when his client's child caught him wearing his client's lingerie; the ensuing humiliation only enhanced the experience. He dabbled in domination by being a slave to women who wanted his money. He experimented with drugs and alcohol; there were run-ins with the law. He became suicidal.


And yet — there were bright moments in his life. DuBois fell in love with a woman who went along with fetishes that had grown into full-blown obsessions. He made friends - albeit, friends who were into drugs. He got married. And he started learning what it would take to be the woman he always knew he really was...

"Self-Made Woman" is a lot of things. It's sad. Poignant. Scary. It's also TMI sometimes and, at just over 200 pages, it's a bit too long.

From Wisconsin childhood to womanhood in Bangkok, author Denise Chanterelle DuBois tells readers of a multi-city, lifetime self-search, in an account that feels overly detailed and overstuffed. Reading it is akin to being held captive by someone who really needs to tell all, including unabashed details about the world of submission and female domination. Those details are titillating for those who share DuBois' fetishes, but cruelty and graphicness make them wince-worthy. Add in memories of drug and alcohol abuse and an account of imprisonment that seemed rushed and you could have a mess of unreadability, were it not for the overall uniqueness, vulnerability, and the truthfulness in this tale.

When the story itself lags, those are the things that redeem it. They're what make this matter-of-factly-told memoir one that sets itself apart by its brutal honesty. It's what will make you want to put "Self-Made Woman" in your hands.

BASQUIAT WOULD BE... PROUD?

I was just recently in Bilbao, Spain and decided to spend a day at the Guggenheim there. The Guggenheim museums have always been among my favorite. Though I spent all of my twenties and much of my thirties in New York City, it is actually the Venice, Italy Guggenheim that was my first "Gugg". The Venice Gugg was actually Peg Guggenheim's personal Venetian Palace that she had turned into a museum for her collection. I've always loved her. She was the black sheep of the family with flamboyant tastes, Avant guade thoughts, a peculiar accent and she tended to fuck a lot of the artists she supported. A woman after my own heart! My first trip to Venice in 2010 was also my first trip to her Palace turned museum and I fell in love with it, her, and the city all at once. It was quite the existential orgy!

The Bilbao Guggenheim, though not my first, is probably my favorite. The city of Bilbao is one of those lovely little gems along the Spanish coast that gets just enough attention to be eclectic but not enough attention to be a tourist trap. On this most recent stroll through the Bilbao Gugg I decided to take a behind the scenes tour. It would allow me a chance to see all the back rooms where they do the framing, restoration, curation, etc. I had a lovely tour guide who, as is always the case with art tour guides, seemed to want to tell me the most pedestrian stories about the artists and the art itself. It always ends up being me who then tells them things I've learned over the years about my favorite arts or pieces of work. We have a laugh, I shock them a bit, and I usually give them some juicy tid bits that they can use in the future.

It just so happened that they were moving a Basquiat from the gallery back behind closed doors because it was going to briefly go join a bunch of other Basquiats for a retrospective. All major works of art travel with a courier. A person who is responsible for never leaving the side of the work of art while it's in motion. They also, of course, nowadays put GPS trackers on the art and so on. It just so happened that the courier of this particular Basquiat was a handsome young Basque man who eyes that seemed to unbutton my pants just by glancing at them.

The courier and I got to chatting about which Basquiat it was while we all waited for the "largest freight elevator in Europe" (as they so proudly proclaimed) to come get us. Since the elevator often moves works of art that are very fragile, it moves very slow. My friends and our tour guide decided to take the stairs the three flights up to our next location. I, as a general rule, do not take stairs. Stairs are a fat kids mortal enemy. Also I wasn't going to miss a chance to be in an enclosed space with both a work of art and a courier who looked like a wet dream. The elevator arrived and he rolled the Basquiat in, with me in toe behind him. As soon as the doors were closed he turned to me to display the magnificently architectural tent he had cleated in his crotchal area. Being a lover of all form of art, I decided immediately that I needed to inspect this exhibition closer. It was a dynamic work of art that was certainly more interactive that the Basquiat that acted like a backdrop. I'd even go so far to say as this massive work of living art belonged more in a petting zoo than a stale gallery. And pet it I did. With my mouth. All the way up to the top floor. One would almost think this ridiculously slow elevator was built for this express purpose. Almost.
