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STAY SAFE RIDE SMART



A bicycle is a great way to get around, but stay safe by following the rules of the road.

- A bicycle is like any other vehicle, so you must follow the rules of the road.

- Bicycles must follow all traffic controls such as signs and signals.
- Bicycles cannot travel the wrong way down a one way street.
- Bicycles must be ridden on the right hand side of a two way street.
- You must signal all turns with hand signals.
- Headsets cannot be worn while cycling.
- Riding a bike while under the influence can get you a DUI in Florida.
- Lights are required between sunset and sunrise
 - A white light is required in front and a red light in the rear.
- Riding on the sidewalk or crosswalk is permitted but with these provisions
 - Pedestrians have the right of way. Yield to pedestrians.

- When passing pedestrians, you must signal your intent before doing so.

- Anyone under the age of 16 must wear a helmet.

Here are a few additional tips that you may find helpful.

- Lock up your bike at all times. If not, you'll probably be walking home.
 - Pass the lock through the frame and the front tire.
 - Be careful not to lock your bike to an adjoining bike by accident.
 - If you lock your bike to private property, it may be impounded.
- When approaching occupied cars, be ready to react if the door opens.

Who should not take GENVOYA?

Do not take GENVOYA if you take:

- Certain prescription medicines for other conditions. It is important to ask your healthcare provider or pharmacist about medicines that should not be taken with GENVOYA. Do not start a new medicine without telling your healthcare provider.
- The herbal supplement St. John's wort.
- Any other medicines to treat HIV-1 infection.

What are the other possible side effects of GENVOYA?

Serious side effects of GENVOYA may also include:

- Changes in your immune system. Your immune system may get stronger and begin to fight infections. Tell your healthcare provider if you have any new symptoms after you start taking GENVOYA.
- Kidney problems, including kidney failure. Your healthcare provider should do blood and urine tests to check your kidneys. If you develop new or worse kidney problems, they may tell you to stop taking GENVOYA.

- Too much lactic acid in your blood (lactic acidosis), which is a serious but rare medical emergency that can lead to death. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you get these symptoms: weakness or being more tired than usual, unusual muscle pain, being short of breath or fast breathing, stomach pain with nausea and vomiting, cold or blue hands and feet, feel dizzy or lightheaded, or a fast or abnormal heartbeat.
- Severe liver problems, which in rare cases can lead to death. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you get these symptoms: skin or the white part of your eyes turns yellow, dark "tea-colored" urine, lightcolored stools, loss of appetite for several days or longer, nausea, or stomach-area pain.

The most common side effect of GENVOYA is nausea. Tell your healthcare provider if you have any side effects that bother you or don't go away.

What should I tell my healthcare provider before taking GENVOYA?

- All your health problems. Be sure to tell your healthcare provider if you have or have had any kidney or liver problems, including hepatitis virus infection.
- All the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Other medicines may affect how GENVOYA works. Keep a list of all your medicines and show it to your healthcare provider and pharmacist. Ask your healthcare provider if it is safe to take GENVOYA with all of your other medicines.
- If you take antacids. Take antacids at least 2 hours before or after you take GENVOYA.
- If you are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if GENVOYA can harm your unborn baby. Tell your healthcare provider if you become pregnant while taking GENVOYA.
- If you are breastfeeding (nursing) or plan to breastfeed. Do not breastfeed. HIV-1 can be passed to the baby in breast milk.

WHAT IS GENVOYA?

GENVOYA is a 1-pill, once-a-day prescription medicine used to treat HIV-1 in people 12 years and older who weigh at least 77 pounds. It can either be used in people who are starting HIV-1 treatment and have never taken HIV-1 medicines before. or people who are replacing their current HIV-1 medicines and whose healthcare provider determines they meet certain requirements. These include having an undetectable viral load (less than 50 copies/mL) for 6 months or more on their current HIV-1 treatment. GENVOYA combines 4 medicines into 1 pill taken once a day with food. GENVOYA is a complete HIV-1 treatment and should not be used with other HIV-1 medicines.

GENVOYA can also be used to replace current HIV-1 medicines for some people who have an undetectable viral load (less than 50 copies/mL of virus in their blood), and have been on the same HIV-1 medicines for at least 6 months and have never failed HIV-1 treatment, and whose healthcare provider determines that they meet certain other requirements.
- GENVOYA does not cure HIV-1 or AIDS. Ask your healthcare provider about how to prevent passing HIV-1 to others.

Do NOT take GENVOYA if you:

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
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"WEDLOCKED: THE PERILS OF MARRIAGE EQUALITY" By Katherine Franke

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m ou're\ not\ in\ any\ hurry.}$

The ring's on your finger, the engagement was just announced, and you both feel like you've got plenty of time. Now's your chance to enjoy the process of getting married. Here's your opportunity to plan the future. But "Wedlocked: The Perils of Marriage Equality" by Katherine Franke asks the question: why marry at all?

When President George Washington died, his will stipulated that his slaves be given their freedom when his wife, Martha, who inherited them, would die.

This, says Katherine Franke, accidentally "put a price on" Martha's head but moreover, it was an acknowledgment on Washington's part that shows one complexity of slavery: marriage between the Washington slaves meant that freeing his without freeing hers could break up families. This issue, and others before and after the Civil War, illustrates how "many of the experiences of African Americans held out a message to the same-sex marriage movement today."

Throughout American history, Franke says, the "rules" of marriage for non-white or gay individuals hid a double-edged sword of enhanced rights and enforced matrimonial laws complicated by pre-Emancipation fluidity of relationships and looser definitions of "marriage" within African American communities then; and by

somewhat of a lack of awareness in the LGBT community, complicated by different state laws now. The bottom line that's often not emphasized: when a couple marries, the state suddenly "acquires a legal interest in your relationship." Now, as then, marriage may also be legally "forced" on a couple: in the case of former slaves, to gain benefits in wartime; for LGBT couples, in the continuation of health benefits. Even after all that, marriage, as Franke reminds readers, has never offered a guarantee from discrimination.

Is it possible, Franke asks, that "the inability to marry creates a kind of freedom from the 'bonds' of marriage?" At a time when the rates of marriage in the Black community are low and LGBT parents are demanding new legal definitions of "family," will marriage become antiquated? Or is the "freedom" to marry just another way for society to meddle in the lives of marginalized individuals?

Surely, few readers would consider "Wedlocked" a fun weekend read. It's not exactly what you'd take to the beach with you. Fun, no. Interesting, absolutely.

It's also quite thought-provoking. Author Katherine Franke is, in part, Director of the Center for Gender and Sexuality Law at Columbia University, and in this book, she asks hard questions between jaw-dropping history lessons and proof that marriage is both burden and boon to anyone who's not white and straight. That's not to say that the institution is dead; instead, Franke wonders if, of all rights denied former slaves and gay individuals, marriage may've been the oddest choice for legal battles.

But which other right would've been better? The answer to that seems to be left open for discussion; indeed, readers are given much to ponder from this heavy-duty, scholarly book. Just beware that time is the key to opening "Wedlocked," now in paperback. Enjoy and contemplate, but don't be in any hurry.

This also gives me the opportunity to get out more often. Sometimes I go to old favorite places, and other times, I try something new.

So much has happened, I may have to continue this one next month.

One of my favorite places to enjoy dinner and conversation is Bliss. Located just at the entrance to Bahama Village on Petronia Street, this little gem offers Colombian cuisine and if you think you know what that is, you are probably wrong. As you probably know, I have a pretty mild palate, and I find the food amazing. Nothing I have eaten has been spicy, but everything is full of flavor. A visitor actually told me I am now obligated to make sure they are still here in a year when he returns. He mentioned that we may go twice during his next visit. I personally can't get enough of Grandma's Shrimp with has a white wine and cream mushroom sauce that is to die for. Bliss is a Key West "must do." If you must stay right on Duval for people watching, a good choice is 915. 915 has a great wine selection but what brings me back time after time is their Filet Mignon. Every time I have it, it is tender and cooked to perfection. Even though I love the filet, it may very well be the side dish that really calls me back. It may seem odd that a high end restaurant would have fries with their filet, but you won't feel that way once you try them. Perfectly cooked and just the right size to make them perfectly crispy without being overly crisp. Plus, you get to watch everyone walk buy wishing they had some 915 french fries!

Something I don't get to do often enough, and I really need to work on that, is take in a show at La Te Da.

The night we chose, it was Christopher Peterson performing. Christopher has been entertaining for so long, well, I won't say how long or he will likely never talk to me again, but let's just say long enough that his show is refined, professional, and still funny as hell. Christopher brings alive the characters of Marilyn Monroe, Carol Channing, Bette Midler, Liza Minnelli, and a few others, all with live vocals, and the whole time transforming between characters basically right on stage. 
So many things are happening in Key West that I keep running out of minutes on my Cricket phone.

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
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
